1. Welcome, Introductions, and Call to Order	The meeting was called to order by Ed Wells at 2:11 pm	None
2. Agency Participation	Ed Wells expressed a desire to have RTO's (Recruit Training Officers) incorporated into the P.O.S.T. program, as well as Lifetime Fitness Instructors. Anyone interested should contact Mr. Wells	None
3. Budget Expenditures	<p>Ed Wells gave an overview of the spending plans forecasted for AJ, CSI and P.O.S.T. programs through the Perkins Grant. He stated that the funds were fifteen thousand dollars down from last year. Some important items he plans on allocating money for are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* IDI (Instructor Development Classes)</li> <li>* Funds to repair firearms.</li> <li>* Replacement guns- M&amp;Ps</li> </ul> <p>Chief Colon asked if we could use SIGs instead of M&amp;Ps. Mr. Wells said he could purchase two M&amp;Ps for the price of one SIG. He further stated that with the budget cuts, purchasing M&amp;Ps would be the easiest guns to afford and train the students with. He assured Chief Colon that M&amp;Ps are similar to SIGs.</p> <p>Chief Colon recommended contacting the LECC on La Brucherie Road to see if we could obtain SIGs from asset forfeiture.</p>	Budget Expenditures were approved.
4. Budget Ratification	<p>Agree/Disagree/Suggestions</p> <p>The Committee was asked if they wanted to continue following the programs in place regarding the Administration of Justice Degree program and the P.O.S.T. certified training programs. The motion was put forth by Mr. Wells, Chief Colon seconded it and the proposal passed unanimously.</p>	Motion passed.
5. Advisory Committee Chairperson	<p>Selection of Chairperson</p> <p>The committee had one nominee for Chairperson. Jesus Serrano was voted the Committee Chair.</p>	Jesus Serrano was selected as AJAC Committee Chair.
6. Other	<p>The Correctional Science program</p> <p>Ed Wells informed the committee that The Correctional Science program was going to be rolled into a specialization attached to the AJ degree but informed the committee that there was such resurgence with the students they should leave it as a major.</p>	CSI to stay as a major and not be attached as a specialization to AJ.
