WHO QUALIFIES

Students who are currently enrolled in or accepted for enrollment and seeking a degree in a college, trade or vocational school, or other qualifying educational institution on a full or half time basis.

WHAT IS REQUIRED

-  Provide proof of academic status;
 -  Maintain good academic standing;
 -  Complete a Participant Agreement;
 -  Remain a student as long as you're employed under the internship: Students may work part-time during the school year and/or full-time during summer and holiday breaks. Students will be placed in leave without pay if they are unavailable to work during the school year;
 -  Perform the job successfully;
 -  Complete 640 hours of on-the-job training before graduation.
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HOW TO APPLY

You must apply online through www.USAJOB.S.gov! You don't need to create an account to browse jobs, but you will need to create an account to apply. Read the announcement thoroughly as it will detail the required resume content and documents necessary for application submission, in addition to other important details about the internship, including possible conversion to permanent federal service! *These announcements will only be open for 5 days.*
